

# Think Sam Will Be World Uncle And Cop

Uncle Sam is going to be a mighty busy fellow once the war is finished and the peace is won, 2,500 delegates to the Herald Tribune Forum in the Waldorf-Astoria were told at the opening sessions yesterday.

Sir Stafford Cripps said a giant international armada of warplanes may be used to police the world, and Secretary of Agriculture Claude R. Wickard said we must be prepared to feed every country where famine and starvation threaten.

Robert Bellaire, former United Press bureau chief in Tokyo, said the only way to keep the Japs from stabbing America in the back a second time will be to invade and occupy their islands.

## Must Forget Revenge.

Sir Stafford, in a radio address from London, told the meeting that "a powerful international air force could reach the most remote corner of the earth to strike at any who sought to break the peace for their own advantage."

"But, neither air power nor any other power on the face of the earth," he added, "can ever maintain a peace that is simply a hot-tempered settlement of revenge."

Asserting it is a "political necessity that starvation disappear in

any country we re-occupy," Secretary Wickard said our re-entry into any land now held by the enemy must be accompanied by a well-planned importation of food, seed and essential supplies.

## Warns of Peace Offer.

"And when we write the peace," he said, "we must remember that we can't have stable, peaceful nations if there is widespread starvation in some parts of the world and huge food surplus in others."

Warning that Japan, once it sees that a continued war will bring complete defeat, will offer this nation a negotiated peace, Bellaire said:

"If we accept such a peace without occupying, at least temporarily, the main islands of Japan, we might as well begin planning for our next war with them. In a few years they will be shouting that America failed to defeat Japan, that she had been unable to invade the holy islands. This, of course, will be the psychological whip with which Jap generals will stir their peoples to a new war frenzy."
